At a time when cuts are destroying our ability to find programs for affordable housing, healthcare, and education, it is not right that we funnel more money into the military-industrial complex. Here in Missouri, students are feeling the effects of their work study amounts being cut. Nationally, the \$1.2 billion work-study program is being cut by \$49 million, which was initially estimated by the U.S. Department of Education as leading to 33,000 students being denied work-study jobs.

Please call your Representative at 202-224-3121 and tell him or her to support amendments to audit and tighten the Pentagon budget (while protecting healthcare and other programs for troops and veterans), rein in the lethal dronesprogram, and end the Authorization for Use of Military Force (AUMF) that gave a green light to the past decade of endless warfare.

Emphasize that in this era of austerity-with sequester-driven cuts to Food Stamps, education, healthcare-many in Congress want to throw money at the Pentagon. Please ask your Representative to support pending amendments which would:

- Audit the Pentagon
- Cut Pork-unnecessary boondoggle weapons systems including the F-35 fighter plane, the V-22 Osprey device and the Abrams tank.
- Eliminate nuclear weapons and provocative foreign military bases
- Rein in the lethal drones program
- End the Authorization for Use of Military Force (AUMF)

Economic conversion is moving to design peacetime manufacturing and retooling military facilities to produce what our communities need.


This webinar will drill down on proposals for Congressional action and state legislation to transition from a war economy to a sustainable peace economy.
